FAMILY DEVOTIONAL

The Goal:

At Champions Centre, one of our core beliefs is that we think 3. That means we don't just think about ourselves—we think about the next generation and the one after that. That's why we encourage families of all kinds to include everyone at home in conversations about Legacy Offering.

Whether you have young kids, teens, or even adult children living at home, this is a chance to walk through the journey together. As you take these steps as a family, you'll all grow in understanding of God's heart for generosity. It's a powerful faith-building opportunity for your household today, and for generations to come.

When To Do It:

Pick a time that works best for your family and make it a weekly non-negotiable. It doesn't have to be long—just about 15 minutes. You could gather after dinner, over breakfast, or even before bedtime.

What You Need:

We've made this simple and family-friendly. All you need is this guide and a Bible. Don't have one? You can access digital versions easily. The YouVersion app or bible. com are great tools. For clarity and ease of reading, we recommend the New Living Translation (NLT).

How to Engage the Whole Family:

This is meant to be an activity for everyone under your roof. Invite your children, teens, or young adults into the spirit of generosity and the vision God has for your family's future. Let each person feel like they are part of the plan.

- Take turns reading the Bible passage together.
- Encourage every voice by calling on each family member by name.
- Share openly, and you'll find it helps others open up too.
- As a family, come up with a simple action step you can live out during the week.
- Close in prayer, giving everyone a chance to pray out loud if they're comfortable.

This is more than a family exercise, it's an investment in faith that will shape today and tomorrow.

Giving From the Heart

Read:

Mark 12:41–44 (The Widow's Offering)

Big Idea:

God sees our heart, not the size of our gift.

Question:

Why do you think the widow's two coins mattered so much to Jesus?

Prayer:

"Lord, help us give with a willing heart, no matter the amount."

God Can Multiply What We Give

Read:

John 6:1-14 (The Boy with the Lunch)

Big Idea:

God can take what we give and use it in amazing ways.

Question:

What's something small you could give (time, kindness, or money) that God could use?

Prayer:

"Jesus, we give You what we have, trusting You can do big things with it."

A Happy Heart in Giving

Read:

2 Corinthians 9:6-7 (God Loves a Cheerful Giver)

Big Idea:

Giving is best when we do it joyfully.

Question:

How do you feel when you give something to someone?

Prayer:

"God, help us give with joy and not with a grumpy attitude."

Trusting God When We Give

Read:

Genesis 22:1–14 (Abraham and Isaac)

Big Idea:

Giving requires trust that God will provide.

Question:

Can you think of a time you gave up something and God gave you something even better?

Prayer:

"Lord, help us trust You with what we give, knowing You always provide."

Generosity in Every Season

Read:

2 Corinthians 8:1-5 (The Macedonian Church)

Big Idea:

Even when life is tough, we can still be generous.

Question:

What's one way we can be generous even if we don't have much?

Prayer:

"God, help us be generous no matter what season of life we're in."

Giving Beyond Money

Read:

Luke 10:25–37 (The Good Samaritan)

Big Idea:

Giving includes our time, care, and help for others.

Question:

Who can we show kindness or help this week?

Prayer:

"Jesus, help us give kindness and love to others, just like You do for us."



Read:

John 3:16 (God Gave His Son)

Big Idea:

The greatest act of giving is God giving us Jesus.

Question:

How does remembering God's gift help us be more generous?

Prayer:

"Thank You, God, for giving us Jesus. Help us give to others because You gave first."
